SERVICES: *Big Brothers and Big Sisters - SUNY Geneseo Chapter* is a non-profit and student run organization which is affiliated with the Rochester Area Big Brother/Big Sister Program, Community Partners for Youth. It is a program which matches children between the ages of 6 and 16 (in need of a one-to-one relationship) with a college student volunteer. Each match is supervised by a caseworker who contacts the volunteer and the child's family each month.

The agency provides professional volunteer training, transportation arrangements when needed, and monthly special events for the big and little. Volunteer requirements include: interview, orientation, filing monthly reports, meeting regularly with caseworkers and coordinators, spending a minimum of 3-4 hours a week with child and a two semester commitment. Volunteers must be at least 18 years of age. All information is confidential.

- **Counseling/Intervention** for young people ages 12-21 and their families to assist them with drug/alcohol concerns; and problems involving school, sexuality, family, runaway, juvenile justice, peers, etc., through individual, group, phone and family counseling process.
- **Prevention Education Services** delivered in a workshop, group, or presentation format for young people in schools, youth groups, clubs, institutions; for parents and professionals working with young people, and for other adults who want more knowledge about the issues facing young people. The checks provided are for 100% juices, fortified with Vitamin C; milk, fortified with Vitamins A and D; iron-fortified cereal; eggs; cheese; and iron-fortified infant formulas. Peanut butter and dried beans are options.

Pregnant, breast-feeding, and postpartum women; infants and children under 5 living in Livingston or Wyoming County and who are income eligible (185% of poverty) qualify.

All services are confidential. Parental involvement and support is always encouraged, but parental consent is not required for adolescents receiving

DESCRIPTION OF FINANCIAL AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Adult Protection: Provides services to adults, including mental hygiene releases, aged, blind, or disabled individuals, and adults 18 years and older, in need of protection. Services include individual and family counseling, home management counseling, case management aide services, health related services, financial management services, and social and legal protective services.

Day Care for Children: Provides financial assistance for day care costs to persons who are employed or attending school if they meet the income guidelines.

Child Protection: Investigates all reports of suspected child abuse and/or neglect. Provides supportive services when families are found to be neglecting or abusing their children/

Employment: Assesses and refers Temporary Assistance Clients for job placement, work experience and training; supervises job search activities; transports and supervises recipients assigned to mobile work crews; maintains and updates client Employability Plans; coordinates employment case activity with other service providers.

Food Stamps: A nutrition program dedicated to reducing hunger and maintenance by supplementing the food purchasing power of eligible low-income individuals.

Medicaid: A program to assist low-income persons in attaining and paying for medical care.

Temporary Assistance: Financial support to individuals and families in financial need.

Foster Care: Provides intake for all children coming into foster care; provides rehabilitation services to families whose children are in foster care; recruits and investigates foster homes for children needing temporary care out of their home.

Adoption: Provides services for adoptable children awaiting adoptive placement and/or placed for adoption, and recruits and investigates adoptive homes for children needing permanent families.

H.E.A.P.: The Home Energy Assistance Program provides energy assistance (fuel, oil, kerosene, liquid petroleum gas, natural gas, wood, electricity) to low-income families who meet eligibility guidelines and

who are under 60 years of age.

Information and Referral: Provides information and referral service to all Livingston County residents; helping individuals find resources to meet their needs either within the Department of Social Services or elsewhere in the community.

Personal Care: Provides personal care services to Medicaid recipients in need of assistance with personal hygiene, nutritional support and/or environmental maintenance due to a medical condition. These services are provided upon the joint agreement of a public health nurse, social worker, and the recipient's personal physician. They are provided as a supplement to the recipient's support group in order to help maintain the person in the community.

Preventive Services for Children: Provides case management and support services to families in crisis to prevent the need for foster care placement. These services include home management, parenting skills, social adjustment, and education/employment counseling.

Meals are served at sites located in Avon (Village Bldg., Genesee St.); Mt. Morris (Swan Senior Center, State St.); Dansville (Masonic Bldg., 68 Elizabeth St.).
 - **Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC):** Available to help eligible individuals age 65 and over who are New York State residents with the high cost of prescription drugs. The *Livingston County Office for the Aging* will provide applications and assist with the application process. EPIC is a cost sharing program.
 - **Transportation Services:** Available through a contract with the Livingston Area Transportation System (LATS), with vehicles operating from Avon, Dansville, and Mt. Morris, to provide transportation to the nutrition sites.

- **Emergency Alert Response System (E.A.R.S.):** A lifeline to people who choose to live independently and alone. A personal emergency response program, useful to frail older persons. The program is operated under a contract with Nicholas Noyes Memorial Hospital.
- **Foster Grandparent Program:** A volunteer program, which benefits both persons 60 years and over, and children with special needs. Grandparents serve 20 hours a week, and receive a small stipend; transportation is arranged.
- **Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP):** The office certifies persons 60 years of age and older for fuel assistance.
- **Home Delivered Meals:** Home Delivered Meals is available to deliver nutritious meals to individuals age 60+ who are homebound, and by reason of incapacitating illnesses and/or disability cannot attend the congregate meal program.
- **Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program:** This program is a coordinated system of state and local agencies responsive to the concerns and problems of older residents of long-term care facilities. Trained, certified volunteer ombudsmen receive, investigate, and resolve concerns made by or on behalf of residents of adult homes, health-related facilities, and nursing homes. They also monitor the quality of care, help protect residents' rights, and assure treatment with dignity and respect.
- **Weatherization Referral Assistance Program (WRAP):** Provides a coordinated link between clients and all available energy-related services. Individuals are provided assistance in locating and utilizing appropriate services.
- **Alzheimers Support Group:** A support group for family and friends caring for an individual diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease or Related Dementia. The program is operated through Noyes Memorial Hospital.

Evaluation Services:

Multi-disciplinary evaluations are provided by an assessment team for children from birth to five years of age suspected of having a developmental delay or disability. Individual evaluations consist of a social history, speech/language, psychological, and health assessment. Occupational and physical therapy evaluations are completed if motor delays are suspected. Other assessments may be needed to determine a child's functional levels. Preschool children, three to five years of age, are referred for evaluation services following contact and signed consent with their school district's Committee on Preschool Special Education. To initiate evaluation referrals and service coordination for children birth to three years of age, contact is made with the county's early intervention official through the Department of Health.

Transportation: Parents/caregivers must provide transportation.

Fee for Services: No charge to parents/caregivers.

Special Services:

Preschool Program: Preschool children, three to five years of age, who have been classified by their school district's Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE) as a "preschool student with a disability" may attend one of the programs located at the Holcomb Building or satellite locations in Mt. Morris and Dansville. Children attend classes daily and programming includes measurable goals based upon each child's specific needs and as written on an Individualized Education Plan (IEP).

Related Services: For those children needing less intensive services, itinerant service provisions are available. Special education, counseling, speech/language therapy, physical and occupational therapy may be provided at the child's nursery school, child care center, Head Start center, or home. A therapy session may also be provided at the Holcomb Building or one of the satellite locations if these locations are convenient for families.

Early Intervention Program: Children, birth up to three years of age, who are determined to need services because of developmental delays or disabilities may attend group learning sessions and/or therapeutic

sessions. Service coordinators and parents, based on evaluations, determine service levels and goals. Services are written into an Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) which is reviewed every six months. Services may be provided at a center location or at home.

Service List: The following special services are available in preschool and early intervention:

- Special education
- Speech/language therapy
- Occupational therapy

Child Care:

KidStart Child Care is located at the Holcomb Building on the SUNY Geneseo campus. Child Care services are open to the community and are provided in a safe, caring environment for children six weeks to twelve years of age. A day care program is open to children up to five years of age and a before/after school program is open to children five to twelve years of age. The before/after school program also has a program located at the elementary school in Avon. As part of a daily classroom routine, each age group has planned age appropriate activities with mealtime, snack times and rest time included. Parents are encouraged to visit and are always welcome to observe the program.

Transportation: Parent/caregivers must provide transportation. Geneseo School District transports school age children to After School Program.

Fee for Services: Fee schedule based on hours of service is available upon request.

Livingston County Head Start Program:

KidStart administers the **Head Start Program** in Livingston County. Head Start is a federally funded comprehensive preschool program with a family services component. Preschool program goals promote the physical, social, emotional, and cognitive growth of each child's literacy and numeracy are primary focuses. Enrollment is open to all preschool children whose families reside in Livingston County and whose income falls within federal income guidelines. Provisions are made for children with disabilities.

SERVICES: Our program is geared toward specially challenged parents that are developmentally disabled people. The *T.R.I. (Teaching, Reaching, Involving) Program* is a nationally recognized, precedent setting program which addresses the needs of these specially challenged families.

Enrollment is open-ended to accommodate the ever-changing demands of parenting. Tasks are approached with a clear understanding that the best interests of children are served when parents develop a sense of self-worth and respect.

The *T.R.I. Program* uses a 3-part approach:

Teaching: Teaches parenting skills in a small group setting. Classes provide training in:

- Child Development
- Discipline
- Budgeting
- Communication Skills

Reaching: Provides mutual support in group sessions, which are facilitated by qualified professionals. Creates an atmosphere of trust, confidentiality, and peer support. Provides full diagnostic psychological testing; counseling in small groups and one-on-one sessions; therapy for sexual offenders and victims; and men's support group for parent fathers raising their children.

Involving: Families come to *T.R.I. Program* isolated; they are not always aware of community resources. To fill this gap, *T.R.I.* provides speakers and field trips and coordinates existing service agencies.

This unique component of the program offers clients chances to expand social and cultural awareness as well as assist them in their daily lives.

Other services*: Full psychological diagnostic evaluations; home visits are made.

Intensive Family Therapy Program: Direct out of home placement for youth on P.I.N.S. petition. They provide directive, structured counseling, psychological evaluations, therapy and in-home visits for a time-limited period in one year. Follow-up after discharge. All referrals are done through the Livingston County Youth Assessment Communications.
